

## **ABSTRAC**

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*This research is a variety of colloquial languages in Madurese speech, the community of Cenlecan Hamlet, Rajun Village, Pasongsongan District. It is a colloquial variety of language that tends to be informal and is used in very informal situations and the language used daily by language-speaking communities in certain areas. The objectives of this research are (1) to describe the variety of colloquial language in the Madurese speech of the cenlecan dedsa rajun village community (2) to describe the meaning of colloquial in the Madurese speech of the cenlecan village.*

*The method used in this research is using a qualitative descriptive method with a sociolinguistic approach, especially colloquial. Furthermore, the source of data used in this study was the speech of the community, while the data was in the form of words contained in the speech. After the data were obtained, the data were analyzed using the agih method by matching the data with the theory, because the data in this study were speech words that contain colloquial without counting the numbers.*

*The results of this study include 2 types, the form of colloquial origin, and the meaning of colloquial origin, including:*

- 1. Colloquial which is found in the words of invitation and calling, removing vowels (a and e) in a word, Using Basic Words and eliminating vowels (e,a,i) and consonants (ng,m,).*
- 2. The meaning of the word "edimma, alako, ampon" in Madurese is in the single word, in the prefix (vowels a and e), there is the word bhipbhi 'and itis found in the conjunction "moso".*
