ABSTRACT

Verbal Phrases in The Sumenep Dialect of Madurese Language

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This study aims to analyze verbal phrases in the Sumenep dialect of Madurese language. Verbal phrases were analyzed in three aspects of type: form, meaning and function of the Sumenep dialect of Madurese.

The type of research is qualitative research, using a descriptive approach. The research procedure uses observation, note-taking techniques and transcripts. Meanwhile, the way to analyze the data is using a table using the entangling and speaking technique, and the BUL technique (for direct elements). The analysis of 80 data in the Sumenep dialect of Madurese vocabulary used phonological and syntactic analysis.

The result of this research is that the form of Madurese language includes aspects of type, form, meaning, and function. Verbal phrases in terms of their position in the Sumenep dialect of Madurese sentence can function as predicates, subjects, objects, complements, and descriptions. Verbal phrases can be formulated as a combination of two or more words that are endocentric attributive or endocentric coordinating with verbal as the core element. Attributive endocentric verbal phrases consist of core elements and additional elements. The core element is filled by the verb, while the additional element is filled by the word added. While the coordinating endocentric verbal phrase is a combination of two words that are the same or parallel, and can be connected with the conjunction 'and' or '.
