

## ABSTRACT

### ***Relationship between Career Guidance and Interest in Advanced Study of Sumenep NU High School Students 2018/2019 Academic Year: 2018. Ika Fariha***

*Keywords: Career Guidance, Interest in Advanced Studies, Students*

*Most students do not understand the talents, interests and various kinds of information about careers, this can be seen from the fact that there are still many students from class XI who are still unsure of the career choices that will be taken, even though students have chosen majors that should have been adjusted to their career interests, even though the students plan to go to college after completing high school education . The aim of this study is to find out the relationship between career guidance and the interest in further student studies and how much the relationship between career guidance and interest in further study of NU high school students.*

*This research is quantitative which obtains student initial test data through the first (pretest) questionnaire before treatment is 1421 with an average of 135. There is a relationship of career guidance after doing treatment / treatment (posttest) with the results of 1514 with an average of 144. The difference between pretest and posttest is 93.*

*Based on the results of this study, it can be concluded that there is a relationship between career guidance and interest in further student studies based on the results of the 1421 and post-1514 pretest differences. The existence of career guidance by the counselor can help students plan for the future after graduation. Students will not be confused with their future choices, more directed and planned. So career guidance is very helpful for students in choosing further study interests. And the relationship between career guidance and interest in further study of NU high school students was 93% which was obtained from the results of the students' pretest and posttest differences. The magnitude of the difference makes the relationship between career guidance towards the interests of students' advanced study well planned.*
